	A roll call attendance was taken and a quorum was not present.	
2. Project Update:	Project Updates:	
	Population Health Plan Update:	
<ul><li>Brief Population Health Plan Update</li><li>Update on ACH Peer Learning Lab</li></ul>	Sarah Kinsler provided an update on the status of the Population Health Plan (PHP). The Plan was reviewed by all of the work groups in October and was approved by the Core Team to continue to move forward. The document is intended to be a blueprint of how to achieve the goals of the SIM project overall toward improving health and reducing costs.

	Jim Hester asked if the draft will be circulated once again before being sent to CMMI in June 2017. Yes the hope is that the newly formed Core Team will send it around again for review.	
	Maura Graff asked how will we address feedback on the PHP? Georgia Maheras stated that all feedback has been documented and has been categorized by the team working on the plan and is kept in a tracking document. Nearly all comments were accepted in whole. In some cases for the PHP there was feedback that may not have been incorporated, such as recommendations that wished to address sub-populations in more detail. In those cases, the document is meant to focus on systems and not necessarily on sub-populations, but to address health in a broader, deeper and more wide-spread manner. Other types of feedback, such as a suggestion to include more focus on	

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	children's issues, were included and the leadership group tried to be thoughtful about weaving more information about that topic throughout the document.	
	Maura further noted that there were three specific interventions that were mentioned specifically which is why some of those kinds of comments were made. It was commented that many changes have been made to the document since its first publication, and that includes making it clearer that those particular interventions were part of the goals of the All-Payer Model. This plan is meant to give a commonality of purpose and approach to population heath planning.	
	Update on ACH Peer Learning Lab Sarah Kinsler and Heidi Klein provided an update on the Peer Learning Lab.	
	January 13 <sup>th</sup> is the next in person peer learning event. This will be to help the groups make a plan for themselves going forward. Sara Barry and Jenney Samuelson will be joining the event. Each of the ten regions will be asked to bring a storyboard to present to the group at large. A final deliverable of this project is a report that will be compiled by the contractor. The report will include the lessons learned from the project and will align with the nine essential elements of the Accountable Community for Health model. This deliverable will be provided to the Core Team who will make recommendations, depending on the topic.	
	National non-profits and a major national health funding organization have already taken notice of the work going on here in Vermont and we look forward to hearing more about this over time.	
	Laural Ruggles commented that we have, indeed, implemented many of the recommendations from the original study by the Prevention Institute in their report. We have a statewide perspective but with regional flavor. The process has been able to highlight the similarities and bring about more consistency across the state.

	<ul> <li>Georgia Maheras presented a first draft of the SIM Sustainability Plan (<a href="here">here</a>, summarized in Attachment 4).</li> <li>This is a draft developed based on recommendations of a private-sector stakeholder group which included at least one co-chair from all Work Groups.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>For activities that are proposed to continue, the Lead Entity will provide stewardship and ownership. The Lead Entity is not the sole decision-making organization, but will work with Key Partners to make sure work continues.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>The Sustainability Plan is due to CMMI on June 30, 2017. It is a required deliverable of the SIM grant.</li> <li>Georgia requested specific feedback on Governance, as well as Lead Entities and Key Partners.</li> <li>We don't expect to have information about resourcing until the new year due to the Governor's Administration transition.</li> <li>For more information: Review the full plan, or watch a recorded webinar on this topic.</li> </ul>

	There were 3 initial priorities  1) Population Health Measures 2) Financing portfolio, not just payment reform 3) Accountable communities for health a. National survey and paper by Prevention Institute b. Grant to RiseVT c. ACH Peer Learning Lab	
	The future of 2017 and beyond:  1) Remain involved in SIM sustainability plan signoff and Population Health Plan sign off 2) Follow Health in all policies task force in new administration 3) Culture of Health grant renewal (Robert Wood Johnson) – an 18 month grant which endeavors to:  a. Take old expenditure analysis lens and expand to include all of the health related expenditures b. Expand to other departments such as transportation c. And look at wellbeing of Vermonters framework to measure health not health care	
	There is an on-going need to keep looking at All Payer-Model integration with Population Health Plan We want to keep the spirit and dedication of this group alive under the new administration – Stay tuned!
